We're living through extraordinary times, and we are very grateful to the CHV community for standing with young leaders and their families in their journey.

The entire CHV community should feel proud for what we've accomplished, because the impact we create together doesn't stay at CHV. It creates confidence and connections amongst teens and families. It opens doors of opportunity. Together we're ensuring that families enjoy economic mobility, and we're helping their young people launch life journeys with the full support of a connected community.

Although numbers can't capture the depth of the trusting, supportive relationships created at CHV, we are committed to measuring everything we can in order to keep improving. And the numbers from this past year speak for themselves:

- More than 1,000 campers participated in CHV's free summer camp in 2025
- 100% of high school seniors in CHV's Leadership Academy last year finished school on time and with a post-secondary plan
- 38 families in our Guaranteed Income Program are receiving \$652 per month with no strings attached

But impact metrics don't measure hugs and high fives. They don't measure the phone call from one CHV parent checking in on another during a family health crisis. Numbers don't capture a teen's growing confidence, or the network they've built after a year serving as a Leader in Training. Numbers don't measure the endless opportunity ahead.

This year is a big one for CHV. We moved into our beautiful new year-round space, the Connors Leadership Academy at Southline in Dorchester. It's already a gamechanger — having our team, teens, and families all together under one roof, right down the street from where many of our families live. We're so grateful to the Yawkey Foundation for their support to make this home a possibility.

CHV partners with Boston families because we know that young people will only thrive when they have trusted support systems at home and in their communities. Our year-round family programs include skill-building workshops, social gatherings, panel discussions and more. Families in our Guaranteed Income Program receive \$652 per month in cash with no strings attached. Other families receive up to \$3,000 for necessities like food, heat, and medical bills through our Emergency Flex Fund.

Families in CHV's Guaranteed Income Program are more than **2x as likely to meet their household needs.**

More than 200 summer camp alumni in grades 9-12 come to the Connors Leadership Academy in Dorchester at least once a week to participate in a year-long curriculum, discussions, trainings, and field trips with peers from across Boston. Teens work with the CHV team on college and career prep, leadership skills, arts and service projects, and more — all on the path to becoming change agents, advocates, and innovators.



More than **200 Leaders in Training** participate in **30 hours of workshops** during the school year.
